- 1. Save the date for our EJ Forum: March 12th, 2024 @ Rutgers Camden
- 2. PDE is currently hiring for a Delaware Community Coordinator, https://delawareestuary.org/home/careers-2/
- 3. USDA: The states of NJ and PA will be advertising RFPs in mid January 2024 of IRA funding opportunities. NJ will be focusing on municipalities and PA will be focusing on a wider array of applicants. DE has not announced their plans for distributing IRA funds yet. 100% of funds will go to underserved communities as defined by CEJST.
- 4. NJ Audubon also recently released a capacity building RFP ("Watershed Restoration and Community Empowerment Program") similar to PDE's mini-grant program: <a href="https://njaudubon.org/watershed-grants/">https://njaudubon.org/watershed-grants/</a>. There will be an introduction webinar on January 10, 2024 at 10am.
- 5. EPA Region 3 + DRBC will be hosting an in-person climate meeting some time in the spring of 2024, more details to follow.
- 6. Kathy brought up the problems that small non-profits, including PDE which is well-established and has nearly 30 staff, are facing following federal compliance, especially related to the BIL, making sub-awarding funds to even smaller community groups to build capacity extremely difficult, as they will also have to follow compliance. People are actually turning away BIL funding. There is still a huge disconnect and injustice that perhaps UWFP can help address between federal agencies huge barrier to entry for funding disadvantaged communities. Hoping that staff time to deal with compliance, the future TCTACs, or private foundations can help. Accessing federal funds is exceedingly difficult for anyone trying to do small on-the-ground EJ/restoration projects.
- 7. Greenbuild 2024 international conference will take place in Philadelphia this year at the Convention Center from November 12-15. They are potentially seeking members for an EJ Advisory Committee.







# 2024 Community Cohort Summary

### Summary

PDE would like to continue using the UWFP as a mechanism to support more urban community leaders via a Community Cohort that will bring them together across all 3 states and 4 cities in our Location. The ultimate goal of this program would be to support and build capacity for community leaders who are already working towards resiliency, environmental justice, public access, sustainability, and health in their communities. PDE would like to form an intercity Community Cohort and plan several events throughout the year focusing on networking, environmental stewardship, and professional development opportunities. Our ultimate vision is a well-connected, empowered, and informed network of community members that are the voice of positive action and change in our Urban Waters communities.

### Cohort Member Eligibility

- 1. Community-based professionals, general community activists with an interest in the environment, and/or emerging environmental leaders
- 2. Lives and ideally works in Camden, Chester, Philadelphia, or Wilmington
- 3. Is actively doing work with community members from their community (does not have to be environmental work)
- 4. Has specific interests and goals for resilience (Land & Water mgmt.; Disaster and Health; Climate) or environmental justice within their community
- 5. Can commit to attending 5 of the proposed 8 events (see timeline below)
- 6. Bonus: is a past or present mini-grant program grantee
- 7. Bonus: organization they work or partner with is new, has a small staff, or is low capacity
